Asian Cities together towards Zero Carbon

Background

The Asia Smart City Conference (hereinafter referred to as "ASCC") is an international conference that brings together representatives from Asian cities, national governments, international organizations, academic institutions, and private companies, aiming to discuss on the realization of a sustainable city where economic growth and a favorable urban environment are compatible. At this conference, representatives from cities will share their vision for growth as well as their current challenges and needs; private companies and academic institutions will propose innovative solutions; international organizations will offer programs to support efforts by cities and private companies; and various knowledges from around the world will be shared. Furthermore, we offer an occasion for participants to find new business opportunities.

This year's 12th ASCC, for the first time in almost four years, will be held face-to-face with the main theme of "Zero Carbon." To create a sustainable city, it is important to achieve zero carbon and build a global network through public-private partnerships. We will share knowledge, know-hows and best practices about urban development that society is currently seeking. We aim to provide a meeting place for a wide range of key players and create further business opportunities for the creation of economically, socially and environmentally sustainable cities.

Characteristics of the Conference


The purpose and expected outcome of the 12th ASCC are as follows:

- 1. Establishment of the marketplace where overseas information and people in the field of sustainable urban development gather and promote business creation.
- 2. Communication towards achieving the goals of the international community such as decarbonization and SDGs.
- 3. Realization of empowerment and implementation of sophistication of ASCC as a knowledge hub for solving urban issues.

12th Conference Outlines

The 12th ASCC will focus on the overall theme of urban carbon neutrality, with sessions aimed to discuss how to realize an effective decarbonized society, how to create a city with hope through decarbonization, and how to expand the city network of decarbonization. The objectives of each type of sessions are the following:

- Thematic sessions: To share best practices and to discuss on future directions among cities (Target number of participants cities: around 30, with the cooperation of international organizations)
- GX business matching sessions and exhibition: To create business opportunities for companies between Japan/Yokohama and overseas) in conjunction with the thematic sessions.
- Plenary session: Yokohama will lead the way for Asian cities and lead to a joint declaration for decarbonization of Asian cities.

In order to enhance its role as an information hub for smart city development in Asia, GALERIO Committee was launched by the experts from the public, private and academic sectors. The contents of each session in this conference are planned by the GALERIO Committee. In cooperation with international organizations and academic institutions, the committee will lead the promotion of smart cities across organizational boundaries.





Yokohama City University actively engages in the Asia Smart City Conference, with students and faculty contributing to collaborative urban challenges. They collaborated with universities in Southeast Asia through the International Academic Consortium for Sustainable Cities (IACSC). In the summer of 2023, Yokohama City University students, along with IACSC members like Thammasat University in Thailand, the National University of Vietnam, and Hasanuddin University in Indonesia, organized a workshop on urban growth and suburbanization challenges at Thammasat University Rangsit Campus.

In this session, students will share insights and proposals for sustainable city development based on the workshop's outcomes. JICA staff will also participate as commentators, offering expertise from the standpoint of international cooperation and urban development.

Thematic Session: Nov. 14 (Tue) 11:00-15:30

Session 1: City Management to Achieve Carbon Neutrality (ADBI)

Cities are vital in addressing climate change and the challenge to limit global warming to 2°C. Over half the global population lives in cities, especially in Asia and the Pacific. Although cities cover just 2% of the land, they produce 75% of global carbon emissions, over 50% of which come from this region. Rapid urbanization requires energy, which exacerbates fossil fuel consumption and thus, climate change. Despite these challenges, climate threat can be an opportunity to adopt low-carbon resilient measures to generate economic benefits, employment, and health improvements. Cities need to adapt and innovate, and to implement appropriate policy reforms to achieve carbon neutrality. This session focuses on measures taken by city governments in the region towards carbon neutrality.

Ms. Joy Blessilda Sinay is a Capacity Building and Training Economist at ADBI. Her areas of interest include macroeconomics, financial systems, and the evolving themes of sustainability and digitalization. Ms. Sinay has extensive experience in economic policy and planning, dealing with diverse economies and stakeholders. He founded the Georgian Tourism Association, and led the Georgian Office of the British International Educational Company LSE. He holds an MBA and law degree.

Her research interests have lied in how to ensure and enhance democratic participatory structures in the digital era as well as designing participatory structures in cities and villages with digital solutions, estimating and evaluating how socioeconomic and environmental factors impact human behaviors, and developing simulations of human mobility by taking these factors into account.

Session 2: Designing Livable and Thriving Cities (WB TDLC)

The World Bank Tokyo Development Learning Center's session will present the key findings and the climate action policy tools from two World Bank publication: 1) Thriving: Making Cities Green, Resilient and Inclusive in a Changing Climate and 2) Unlivable: What the Urban Heat Island Effect Means for East Asia's Cities. The first report uses data from 10,000 cities worldwide to explore the relationship between growth of cities and the impact on the climate. The second report sampled 100 East Asian cities to understand the impact of urban heat effects on cities and outlines the options for policy action that reduce local temperatures and better prepare residents for heat waves. These reports are intended to help local and national policymakers utilize policy instruments revolving around information, incentives, insurance, integration, and investments, to design green, resilient, and inclusive cities.

Session 3: Case studies of Well-being Indicators and Policy Case Studies through Industry-Academia-Government Collaboration (SCI-J)

Japan's smart cities are entering the implementation phase, and there is a need to reexamine the purpose of smart cities and explore how technology enhances the well-being of citizens. In the G7 Finance Ministers and Central Bank Governors Meeting held in Niigata City this May, "pursuit of welfare" was on the agenda, the need for multidimensional indicators for measuring welfare were discussed. The Liveable Well-being City Index (LWCI) measures the liveability and well-being of citizens through both subjective and objective measures, and the results for all municipalities and prefectures are available to public for free. In this session, we will explore how to enhance the well-being of citizens through specific case studies using the LWCI.

Furthermore, a major social issue nowadays with significant impact on well-being is difficulties young people face in life, as evidenced by the increase in depression and the high suicide rate. The increasing complexity of the environment surrounding young people has led to a decline in their self-characteristics and has contributed to difficulties in life. To create a society where young people can achieve well-being, it is necessary to improve their self-characteristics and acquire a resilient mind. A research group, led by Professor Tomoyuki Miyazaki of Yokohama City University and comprised of universities, companies, and local governments, is advancing the development of a 'Meta-Care City' in virtual space. The initiative aims to offer consultations and care to address the difficulties young people face and their mental health issues.

In this session, we will discuss LWCI's potential to enhance citizens' well-being, initiatives to alleviate difficulties young people face, and how the efforts contribute to citizens' well-being.
